

Reformation Sunday October 26, 2025 Home, Sweet Home



Whether you have lived in several places or very few, you probably have a method for transforming a space to live into a home. Maybe you put family photos on the walls, set out mementos, or spread a favorite quilt on the bed. These touches are important if we want to feel like we belong in a new space.

Jesus offered the gift of belonging to people who newly believed in him, but they had a hard time accepting it.

He said if they would continue, or abide, in his word, they would be his disciples, know his truth, and be set free. They would receive the gift of belonging to his household forever.

To us the listeners' response is surprising, as if the new believers had shut their ears as soon as they heard Jesus say, "The truth will make you free." They didn't want to accept that there was anything they needed to be set free from. On a deeper level, they didn't want to believe that someone else would need to set them free. Jesus' words invite us to reflect on where our freedom comes from, and where we belong, as his disciples.

On Reformation Sunday, we celebrate how the Holy Spirit is constantly reforming the church, the community of Jesus' disciples. We give thanks for the gospel message that Jesus saves us from sin and death through his cross and resurrection. We don't have to earn our salvation; we can simply trust that Jesus is the one who makes it possible. That's how we receive genuine freedom—as a gift of God's grace. Thanks to Jesus, we have a permanent home. No matter how many times we move, we abide with Jesus forever. This festival day encourages us to keep listening to Jesus' word, growing in faith as his disciples, and giving thanks that with him, we are always at home.

Synod Weekly Announcements:

Installation of Bishop Stoller

On Saturday, October 18, Rev. Melissa Stoller was installed as bishop of our synod. The sanctuary of Berkeley Hills Lutheran Church overflowed with ministers, lay people, bishops from other synods of the ELCA, heads other Church denominations, friends, and family members. Hundreds more joined by livestream and at watch parties hosted by congregations throughout our synod. Presiding Bishop Yehiel Curry presided over the installation and many individuals from our synod participated in various parts of the service.

In addition to the vows a bishop takes when installed, we were also asked to make promises:

"People of God, representatives of this synod, will you receive Melissa as a servant of God and a shepherd in the church of Jesus Christ? Will you pray

for her, help and honor her for her work's sake, and in all things strive to live together in the peace and unity of Christ?"

Nicene Creed Study Guide

For the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, the Office of the Presiding Bishop commissioned a study guide on the council that would be ideal for congregations and classrooms. ELCA theologians Ashley Hall (Creighton University) and Man Hei Yip (Wartburg Seminary) consider the content of the creed, the historical circumstances surrounding it and its implications for the church today, including for ecumenical (e.g., Lutheran-Orthodox) and interreligious (e.g., Christian-Jewish) relations. The guide offers units on postcolonial perspectives and the role of women in the council.

Supporting Community Members Facing SNAP Changes

The SWPA Synod Hunger Elimination Action Team is working to respond to the changes to hunger programs in our area. Upcoming Commemorations

Philipp Nicolai, died 1608; Johann Heermann, died 1647; Paul Gerhardt, died 1676; hymnwriters Sunday, October 26, 2025

These great hymnwriters all worked in seventeenth-century Germany in times of war and plague. Nicolai, a pastor, lost 1,300 parishioners to plague, 170 in one week. He wrote "O Morning Star, how fair and bright" and "Wake, awake, for night is flying." Heermann's hymns, including "Ah, holy Jesus," often express the emotions of faith. Gerhardt, perhaps the greatest Lutheran hymnwriter, was a pastor in Berlin.

Simon and Jude, Apostles Tuesday, October 28, 2025

We know little about these apostles. Simon is listed as "the zealot" or Cananean in New Testament lists. Jude, also called Thaddeus, asked Jesus at the last supper why he had revealed himself to the disciples but not to the world.

Reformation Day Friday, October 31, 2025

By the end of the seventeenth century, many Lutheran churches celebrated a festival commemorating Martin Luther's posting of the Ninety-five Theses, a summary of abuses in the church of his time. At the heart of the reform movement was the gospel, the good news that it is by grace through faith that we are justified and set free.

All Saints Day Saturday, November 1, 2025

The custom of commemorating all of the saints of the church on a single day goes back at least to the third century. All Saints Day celebrates the baptized people of God, living and dead, who make up the body of Christ. On this day or the following Sunday, many congregations will remember the faithful who have died during the past year.
